


Much of Global Oil Production Comes from the Middle East


Oil production as a % of world total as of 2009



- Discontent of masses
- Monarchies: Law, Money, Military
- > People: Reforms, Security Non-Violent Protests
- Dictatorships: Military, secret service. Fear, Terror, executions, massacres (Black September, Hama)
- People: Regime Change. Armed Resistance, civil war, insurgency, flight.
- Army: Regime survival, economic benefits, corruption
